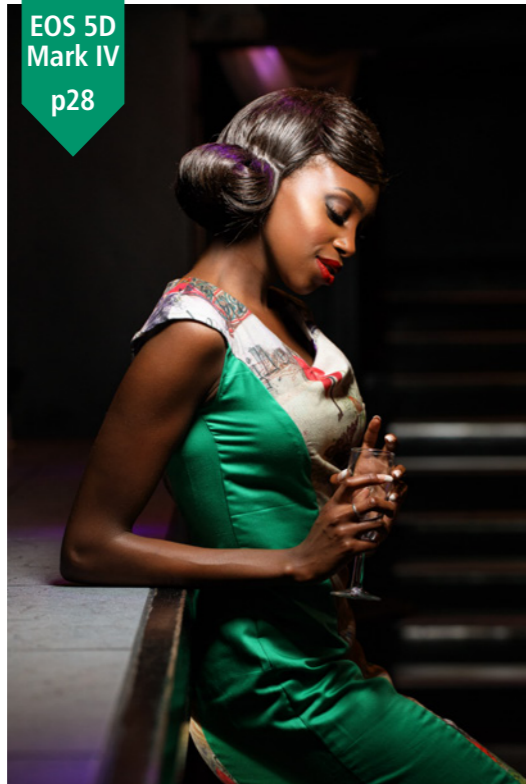

Anatoleya says, "The effect I'm going for is to juxtapose long exposures with portraiture photography. Long exposures impart a unique and distinctive feel to images. And to achieve it the model needs to remain absolutely still, so only they are sharp. For that extra 'pop' factor I combine High Dynamic Range (HDR) technique (using up to five bracketed exposures) together with long exposures."



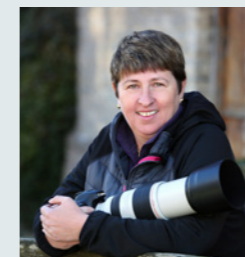

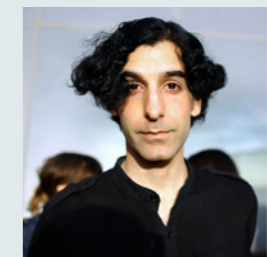

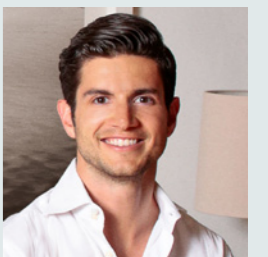
